Since joining Suncor in 2000, Kris has held a variety of roles, including positions in the General Counsel's office and leading business services, strategic planning, and business development in Suncor's US downstream business. In 2007, Kris joined Suncor's Oil Sands business where he held increasingly senior roles managing business services, strategic planning, production planning and logistics, and the operation of Suncor's power generation, transmission assets and utility operations. Prior to his current role, Kris was Senior Vice-President of Supply, Trading and Corporate Development, accountable for corporate strategic planning, crude supply and marketing, as well as the corporate process and information office.

Kris obtained his bachelor of arts with honours from the University of Alberta in 1992, and his bachelor of laws from Dalhousie University in 1995. He is a member of the Alberta and Colorado bars. Prior to joining Suncor, Kris was a lawyer at a respected law firm in Calgary, Alberta.

Kris sits on the Board of Directors of Actua, Canada's largest science, technology, engineering and mathematics youth outreach organization. He is also Chair of the 2016 United Way of Region of Peel Campaign.
